Obituary: Cathy Leigh James

With deep sadness we remember the death of our colleague Dr. Cathy James on December 12, 2007 after a courageous struggle with cancer. She will long be remembered as an active member of CHEA, a beloved teacher and mentor to her students in the Liberal Arts Program at Seneca College, at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education (OISE), and at Mt. St. Vincent University. A University of British Columbia and OISE graduate, Dr. James was a passionate researcher and prize-winning scholar. In 1999, she was awarded the NEA/ Spencer Post-Doctoral Fellowship to further her research on Toronto's Settlement Movement, 1900-1930. Her chapter in *Learning to Practice: Professional Education in Historical and Contemporary Perspective* won the CHEA Founders' Prize for best English-language article/chapter on the history of education 2004-2006.

Nous avons l'immense douleur d'annoncer que notre collègue, le professeur Cathy James a succombé le 12 décembre 2007 au cancer contre lequel elle avait lutté avec courage. Elle était un membre actif de l'ACHE, une enseignante et guide aimée de ses étudiants au programme de Lettres au Collège Seneca, et à l'Institut pour les Études en Éducation de l'Ontario (OISE) et à l'Université Mont Saint-Vincent. Ancienne élève de l'Université de la Colombie Britannique et de l'OISE, Mme James était une chercheuse engagée et une lauréate de plusieurs concours pour son travail d'érudition. En 1999, elle avait obtenu une bourse postdoctorale pour poursuivre ses recherches sur le Settlement Movement, 1900-1930 de Toronto. Son chapitre dans *Learning to Practice: Professional Education in Historical and Contemporary Perspective* s'était vu décerner le Prix des fondateurs de l'ACHE, 2004-2006 pour le meilleur article ou chapitre en anglais sur l'histoire de l'éducation.
